

# Nobleboro-Jefferson Transfer Station

In an attempt to make the Transfer Station as efficient and safe as possible, I am providing an informational sheet for our customers. I hope this information will help to clarify some of our rules and procedures.

We want everyone to be safe when they are at the station. We have stop signs as you enter the area to bring in your trash, demolition, or recycling. Please always stop at the stop signs before proceeding into the parking area.



We also ask that you keep your driving speed, both forward and reverse, to 5 mph.



There are two lanes entering the parking area. The right lane is for customers that intend to back-up into the compactors. The left lane is for customers that intend to walk in their trash. Correct use of the lanes helps prevent confusion in traffic flow.



We still have many people that park directly in front of our compactor lanes. Doing this prevents other customers from using these lanes and slows down the flow of traffic. Please do not block the compactor lanes.



We have a "swap area" that is between our two compactors. Many people enjoy looking over the items that are brought in for reuse. We want customers to enjoy this process, but must ask you not to slow traffic when you want to look around. Please throw out your trash, move your vehicle to another location, then come back and check out the goodies.



Recently, we have removed our 1-7 plastic recycling containers. This means that all of these plastics must go in the trash. We are still recycling #2 clear and solid plastic, along with rigid plastic. Please do not put any 1 -7 plastic in any recycling containers. You should also never put any plastic bags, film plastic or styrofoam in any recycling containers. These materials go in the trash.



The Paint Care Program is a great way for customers to safely dispose of many paint products. We continue to get materials associated with painting that the program does not take. Examples of these products are thinners, mineral spirits, solvents, aerosol paints, auto and marine paint, adhesives and more. Please do not drop any of these or other non-paint care products when you are bringing in appropriate material. There is a sign on our metal building door that lists the products that we can and cannot take. We also have pamphlets that clearly explain the program. We are working on a grant to fund a Household Hazardous Waste Day that will allow you to bring in most hazardous wastes you would have around your homes, barns, sheds, garages or cellars.



Recently we moved our metal container to the far end of the line of open top containers. Our demolition containers are now the first and second containers after you go by the office. Also, if you find the gates closed on any of the open-top containers, please do not throw materials in that container.

I hope this information will be helpful to you as you make your way around the station.
